Inés Lozano-Palacio (PhD) is a junior lecturer in English and Linguistics at the University of La Rioja (Spain). Her research interests include Cognitive Linguistics, pragmatics, and literary theory. Her research work has mainly focused on figurative language, especially irony, with particular emphasis on the cognitive operations involved in figures of speech, and on how these processes may enrich the analysis of the use of language in literature. Her research has been published internationally in high-impact journals and book series such as *Metaphor and Symbol* (Taylor and Francis), *Cognitive Semantics* (Brill) or the *Figurative Thought and Language Series* (John Benjamins). Dr. Lozano-Palacio has delivered over 20 conference talks internationally and has been an invited plenary speaker in several higher-education institutions, such as the University of California, Berkeley (USA), the Beijing Language and Culture University (China), and the State University of Petrozavodsk (Russia). Her most recent work explores irony from the perspective of Cognitive Modelling, building a unified framework of analysis of irony. Dr. Lozano-Palacio has been a visiting scholar at the University of California, Berkeley, and the University of Helsinki (Finland). She is part of various national and internationally funded research groups and currently serves as the associate editor of the *MetBib Project* and an assistant editor of the *Review of Cognitive Linguistics* (both edited by John Benjamins).
