Short Biography

Raymond W. Gibbs, Jr. is a cognitive scientist and former Distinguished Professor of Psychology at the University of California, Santa Cruz. His research interests focus on embodied cognition, pragmatics and figurative language. He is the author of almost 300 articles and book chapters and has published many books, including "The poetics of mind: Figurative thought, language and understanding" (1994), "Intentions in the experience of meaning" (1999), "Embodiment and cognitive science" (2006), "Metaphor wars: Conceptual metaphor in human life" (2017), and (with Herb Colston) "Interpreting figurative meaning" (2012), all published by Cambridge University Press. He is also editor of the "Cambridge handbook of metaphor and thought" (2008) (CUP), and the former editor of the journal "Metaphor and Symbol."
