Degree Certificate

The result that appears on your degree certificate is the **mathematical means** of the following 3 grades:

- A. Grades obtained for all the MIR and MNY courses divided by 108 (= the number of credits they carry) according to the following formula:

$$\frac{((\text{grade1 for subject1} * \text{the number of credits it carries}) + (\text{grade2 for subject2} * \text{the number of credits it carries}) + \dots + (\text{grade35 for subject35} * \text{the number of credits it carries}))}{108}$$

C. the grade for the final examination
