EXPLANATION OF PREREQUISITES

A prerequisite not enclosed in brackets, e.g. BBI-NEDD-301, is a **'strong' prerequisite**; it must be completed successfully at least one semester before the course in question for which it is a prerequisite.

A prerequisite enclosed in brackets, e.g. (BBI-NED-301), is a **'weak' prerequisite**; it can be taken up in the same semester with the course in question for which it is a prerequisite, but must be completed successfully for the course for which it is a prerequisite to be valid (if the prerequisite course is failed, the course for which it is a prerequisite will be invalid; such a course (with its prerequisite) may be retaken in the next semester at the earliest).

A prerequisite with an equals sign (=), e.g. =BBI-NED17-401, is a prerequisite that must be taken in the same semester with the course in question for which it is a prerequisite (as opposed to a 'weak' prerequisite, if the prerequisite course is failed, the course for which it is a prerequisite will still be valid).

GRADUATION AND THESIS

- From the AY 2020/21, the Thesis has to be submitted electronically, via Neptun. The Thesis needs to be prepared and uploaded in an electronic format (PDF, Word or zip). You can upload only 1 document/file to Neptun (including all attachments).
- While uploading it, the student needs to declare in Neptun that the Thesis is their own intellectual product.
- Please, take the university's regulations regarding plagiarism-checking into consideration.
- From September 2021, the supervisor's consent is needed for uploading the Thesis on all study programmes. For the approval, click on the button 'Thesis admission request' (in Neptun under Studies > Degree Thesis/Thesis application).

The Final Examination

The aim of the final examination is to examine and assess whether the student has been able to acquire and apply all the necessary knowledge, skills, and abilities required for the BA degree.

The final examination consists of two parts: (i) a written and (ii) an oral examination. The student is assessed on a scale of 1 to 5. The aim of the final examination is for the student to demonstrate his /her proficiency in Dutch and a satisfactory knowledge of the fields of Dutch literature, history, culture, and linguistics.

- i. During the written examination, the students has to demonstrate his / her proficiency in the Dutch language, i.e. he / she is able to use the language at C1 level (CEFR).
- ii. The oral part of the final examination is held before a committee and it consists of two parts
 1. Presentation of the thesis (defence of the thesis)

The candidate briefly introduces the main questions, method and results of his / her thesis by means of a presentation (e.g. PowerPoint, Prezi). During the presentation he / she responds to the criticism and answers the questions given in the referee's report, as well.

The presentation may not exceed **15 minutes**.

Based on the presentation, the committee can make sure that the thesis is independent work of the author and that the author is able to present his / her main findings orally, as well. The presentation will be evaluated by the committee based on the following 5 criteria: content, structure, language use, presentation technique and response to the referee's report.
 2. Presentation of a main subject area

The student draws and then discusses a topic from one of the two general subject areas that do not match the subject of the thesis. The list of topics for the final examination comprises 6 topics for each subject area (linguistics, literature and cultural history). During the examination, the committee may refine the question related to the given topic and they may also ask questions related to other topics.

The final result of the final examination is the mathematical average of the three marks received at the final examination (written exam, defence, discussion of a topic). If the candidate fails any of these parts, the relevant regulations of the HKR are to be followed.

Prerequisites for the Final Examination

1. The Student is in possession of the final certificate ("abszolutórium" in Hungarian): the final certificate confirms that the student has completed all the required study units and related general academic obligations as specified in the Study Unit List (except for the thesis, the required language proficiency examination, and the final examination), and has collected all credit points specified in the qualification requirements, except for those to be obtained for the thesis. The final certificate is to be issued in the semester in which the student has met all the requirements for the final certificate.
2. The Student has no outstanding financial obligations (such as e.g. an unpaid tuition fee or any other type of unpaid fee) and the student has returned all University property.
3. The Student has submitted a thesis in time and the thesis has been awarded a pass mark.

Note: You must complete ALL the prerequisites at least 3 days before the final examination (there can be no examinations left for after the final examination).

Registering for the Final Examination

The Student must register for the Final Examination in the semester when the exam is attempted.

Degree Certificate

The degree certificate states the weighted average of the grade received on the Final Examination (A) and the grade for the thesis (B) according to the following formula: $(A*0,45) + (B*0,55)$.

According to Section 84 (6) of Academic Regulations, (HKR) the diploma is classified according to its average down to two decimals:

- outstanding (5), if the average is 5.00
- excellent (5), if the average is 4.51–4.99
- good (4), if the average is 3.51–4.50
- satisfactory (3), if the average is 2.51–3.50
- pass (2), if the average is 2.00–2.50.
