Minors are primarily advertised for students studying at the Faculty of Humanities of Eötvös Loránd University, observing the prescribed entrance requirements. Depending on the capacity of the institution and based on an institutional decision, students from other faculties of ELTE may also apply. Students from other universities may apply to a minor with the consent of the Director of Studies. Key to abbreviations:

Explanation of Prerequisites

- A prerequisite with no equals (=) sign or parenthesis (e.g. ANG-102E): ‘strong’ prerequisite; must be completed successfully at least one semester before the course unit in question for which it is listed as a prerequisite.
- A prerequisite with equals (=) sign (e.g. (ANG-101E)): ‘weak’ prerequisite, must be completed successfully in the same semester as the course unit in question is listed.

If there are more applicants than places, acceptance is based on the average result acquired in the English language courses from the first two semesters.
